Notification

Scheme of examinations for M.B.B.S. as per CBME 2023 (Applicable for all batches including students admitted as per CBME 2019 and all examination after 01/08/2023)

Internal assessment – As per CBME Regulation 2023 NMC

Assessment of internal examination as per subject wise Performa attached in CBME regulation 2023.

Total marks 40 (Theory 20 marks, Practical 20 marks) – 50% combined theory and practical (Not less than 40% in each) for eligibility for university examinations.

1. To assess the internal marks, there shall be no less than three internal assessment in each Pre/ Para clinical subjects and no less than two examinations in each clinical subjects in professional years.
2. When subjects are taught in more than one phase, the internal assessment must be done in each phase and must contribute proportionately to final assessment.
3. The final internal assessment in a board clinical specialty (e.g. Surgery and allied specialties etc.) shall comprise of marks from all the constituent specialties. The proportion of the marks for each constituent specialty shall be determined by the time of instruction allotted to each.
4. The sessional examination preceding the university examination may be similar to pattern of university examination.
5. **The total marks obtained be reduce to out of 20 for theory and 20 for practical .**
6. **The result of internal assessment should be displayed on notice board before the university examination.**

University examinations –

(A) Theory -

There shall be each paper of 100 marks (Section-A 50 marks and Section-B 50 marks). The Question paper pattern for each section as follows :-

Framing of questions be done so as to cover the active syllabus and guideline given by NMC on competency based under graduate curriculum.

Note:- One Short notes (05 Marks) in section B of Paper should be based on AETCOM Module

(B) Practical – Total marks 100*

Practical /clinical – 80 marks and viva voce 20 marks.

- ❖ **In subject of General Medicine, General Surgery and Obstetrics and Gynaecology marks in practical examination-200.**
(Practical/clinical-160 marks and viva voce 40 marks)

Attendance:-

1. There shall be minimum 75% attendance in theory and 80 % in practical for eligibility to appear for examination in that subject.
2. Learner who do not have at least 75% attendance in the electives will not be eligible for the final part II/ NEXT .
3. If the attendance is inadequate at the time of annual examination, the student can not appear in supplementary examination , such student is required to take classes with junior batch to compensate for his attendance deficit, specially the course he/she missed .Student will be eligible to appear in the examination with junior batch.

Criteria for passing in the subject :-

1. Mandatory to get 40% marks separately in theory and practical (Practical=practical+viva) and totally 50 % for theory plus Practical.
2. There shall be **no grace** marks to be considered for passing in an examination.
3. A learner shall not be entitle to graduate later than **ten (10) years** of his/her joining the first M.B.B.S. course .
4. No more than **four attempts** shall be allowed for a candidate to pass the first professional examination. Total period for successful completion of first professional course shall not exceed **four (4) years**. Partial attendance of examination (either theory or practical) in any subject shall be counted as an attempt.
5. Passing in the first professional is compulsory before proceeding to second MBBS training. It is to inform all the students that unless the student pass successfully in the first MBBS examinations they will not be promoted to second MBBS. Moreover, if a candidate has failed to pass in the supplementary examination he/she will have to repeat the first MBBS course curriculum and appear for the University examination of first MBBS with the new batch.
6. A learner, who fails in the second professional examination, shall not be allowed to appear in third professional part I examination unless she he passes all subjects of second professional examination, but allow to join training.
7. Passing in third professional (Part I) examination is not compulsory before starting part II training, however passing of third professional (Part I) is compulsory for being eligible for third professional (Part II) examination.

Instructions for the conducting practical examination:-


1. **Appointment of Examiner** – Minimum eligibility for examiner - **4 year** as a assistant professor after obtaining P.G. Degree following MBBS.
2. For the practical/clinical examinations, there shall be at least four examiners for every learner, out of whom no less than 50% must be external examiners of the 4 examiners, HOD /senior-most internal examiner shall act as the chairman and coordinator of the whole examination programme so that uniformity in the matter of assessment of candidate is maintained.
3. Requirement of examiners (External and Internal) for conducting the practical examination in each day is 02 external and 02 internal (must insure each student should be evaluated by all 04 examiner). In case examination is going to **more than 03 days**, in such case college may send separate panel of external examiners **if recurred** .
4. A maximum of 40 students can be examined in a day.
5. Colleges shall send proposal of eligible internal examiners and eligible external examiners (a minimum of two-fold of the number of external examiners required in each subject) to university , **immediately after release time table of examination**.

6. External examiner preferably from outside the university/State. Only in special condition university may grant permission for **one external** from this university.
7. The examiners for general surgery and allied subjects as well as for general medicine and allied subjects, shall be from **general surgery and general medicine respectively**.
8. All eligible examiners with requisite qualifications and experience can be appointed internal examiners by **rotation in their subjects**.
9. Colleges are requested to send sealed envelopes of all practical marks in a single envelope after completion of examination.
10. Colleges are requested NOT TO SEND copy of internal marks to the university, the same may be kept at college level.

Clinical Posting – As per NMC

Note – Clinical postings shall start no later than **two weeks** after completion of University examinations.


